### A 3-day training workshop

In the frame work of the Poverty Environment Initiative, a training workshop will be organised for key decision makers and members of the National Consultative Committee. The main aims of the training are:

- Provide participants with a better understanding of the environment economic approach and its methodology.
- Discuss with participants the preliminary results of the macro study
- Discuss and brainstorm with participants potential corrective measures and main recommendations

The training workshop is a balance between theoretical and practical inputs, giving participants the opportunity, through group works, to apply what they have learned. It includes advanced theory on most up-to-date tools and is based on modern didactical and interactive methods in order to enhance exchanges and learning between participants and internationally recognised experts.

The 3-day workshop is organised in 2 folds:

- **theoretical inputs** on environmental economics fundamentals with case studies and group works (session on Day 1 and Day 2 with yellow shading)
- presentation of the preliminary results of **the macro study** undertaken by the PEI project and its team of experts; discussion and brainstorming concerning corrective measures and main recommendations (session on Day 2 and Day 3 with blue shading)

The workshop will also enable the National Consultative Committee to formally validate and/or provide feedback on macro level results. Discussions will be captured in minutes of the workshop and will then be shared with the working team for elaborating the final version of the macro level report.

Additionally the Committee is also expected to provide feedback on the key environmental economic issues of the case studies (fishery; agriculture-forestry; health) that are studied by the team of experts.
